SERVICE AND SERVICE PROMOTION Maintain regular and open communications with all governing bodies, boards, librarians and the general public regarding the operations of the Suring Area Public Library.

- ➤ On March 11, I gave a Director's Report to the Town of Breed and March 18 to the Village of Suring. I will be giving reports to the Towns of Bagley and Mountain in May.

- ➤ On March 19th, the staff and I, as well as the Village went through ALICE training. After the training Laurie, Tina, Sam and I discussed more programming for the library, the Summer Library program, the girls did some weeding, we went through scheduling, discussed possibly raising the cost of our copies and prints and basically everything that was on the agenda. It was a very productive day.

- We now have the infosoup app that you can install on your phone. Now you can manage your account, search the catalog and renew and reserve items from your phone.

- The library has Story Time on Tuesday mornings from 9:30-11 AM.
- ➤ Hook & Knit takes place the 1st and 3rd Wednesday's of the month at 2:00 PM.
- Maker Monday takes place the 2nd Monday of the month at 2PM. New View from Gillett have started coming again.
- ➤ The Summer Library Program planning is coming along nicely. Sam already has a lot of the crafts ready to go for the program. I also have 3 entertainers lined up throughout the program: June 13 at 2 PM, Jeff McMullen/Magician; June 21 at 1 PM, Jim Lenz/Magic and Science Guy; July 10 at 10 AM, Dinosaur Dimensions with Curt Strutz. We have received, to this point, \$715 from area businesses.
- This week is National Library Week. For the kids, we have a Scavenger Hunt, coloring pages and a Take and Make Craft. Kids that finish the Scavenger Hunt will be entered into a drawing.
