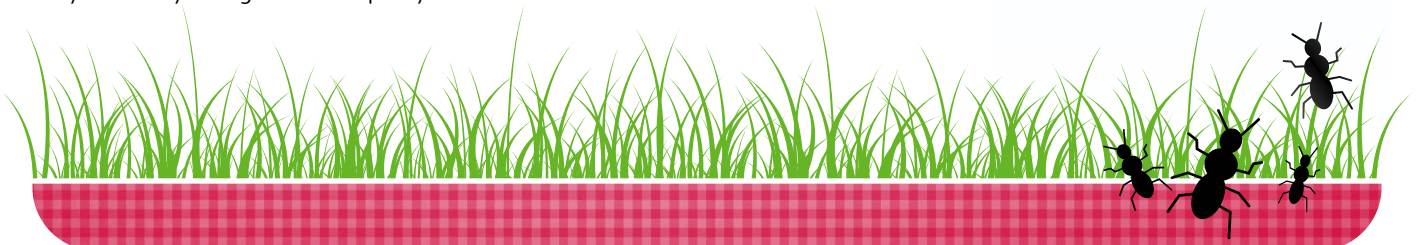

The biggest, and most important change is that both the younger children (ages birth to 2nd grade) and the older children (3rd grade to 6th grade) will all be meeting at the same time! All groups will meet on Tuesdays from 10:00 am to 11:30 am. We hope this will make it easier for everyone to attend and have fun during the Summer.

Reading during the Summer is very important and the reason we do this type of programming. We want to encourage a lot of reading this summer. Last year the children who participated read 542 hours over the 8 week program... Let's see if we can top that this year! As the children read they will be earning tickets to the prize raffles! More reading will get them more tickets. More tickets will be more chances to win some really great prizes. Let's get our reading on!

Everyone can be a part of the Summer Reading Program. Children ages birth to 6th grade are a part of the weekly program (others can join too depending on situations, just ask) while everyone else participates in the BINGO program (see page 3).

Registration for the Summer Reading Program will open on Monday, May 18, 2015.

August 4: A truly SUPER Party will happen!



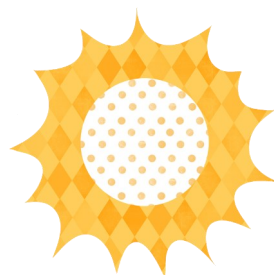
Adult & Teen Summer Reading Program

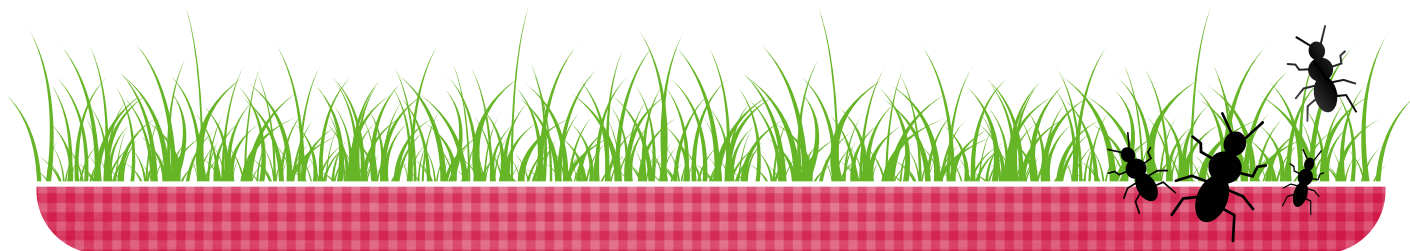
